A DESCRIPTION

The three light South window depicts our Lord in the centre calling, in Divine Charity, all men unto Him. The early symbol of the Saviour is displayed by the Pelican feeding its young with her blood. The Pelican, we are told, fervently loveth her young birds.

Yet when they are haughty and begin to wax hot, they smite her in the face and wound ber, and she smiteth them and slayeth them, and after three days she mourneth for them and then striking herself in the side till the blood runs out, she sprinkleth it upon their bodies and by virtue thereof they quicken again. (St. Augustine).

At the top of the light is shown the Dove, as

symbol of the Holy Spirit.

In the left hand light is St. Paul holding the sword of his martyrdom. The head of the light depicts units of armour, expressing what the apostle said in his epistle, "Put ye on the whole armour of God". In the base are the recognized armourial hearings of the apostle, supported by a kneeling angel.

The right hand light portrays the beloved Disciple, St. John. He holds the Chalice in one hand and in the other the Book of Revelation. In the top of the light is the emblem of St. John the Evangelist, the Eagle holding the Gospel, at the base are the arms of the Saint.

Plewing throughout the whole window in a decorated pattern is the vine embracing the whole window and significant of our Lord's words. "I am the Vine, ye are the branches".
